What is the High School Giving Circle?

A group of up to 20 high school students from throughout Washoe County form the Youth in Philanthropy High School Giving Circle (HSGC) advisory committee. As a member of the HSGC committee, you and your peers will learn about charities in your community and then decide to which you will give all or a portion of \$10,000.

What do I have to do?

- Be part of a team of other HSGC committee members
- Talk about community issues that interest you
- Give away \$10,000 to charities that serve arts, culture, environment, education, human services

What does it cost?

Nothing. This program is paid for by a fund holder at the Community Foundation. All it costs is your time.

How much time will it take?

75 minutes once a week for 10 weeks—from September to December. All meetings are held on Thursdays from 3:40-5 p.m. (No meeting the week of Thanksgiving!)

Where will we meet?

Due to COVID-19 we will be using a hybrid model, breaking up the 75 minutes between virtual meetings and independent study.

What's in it for me?

- A way to make a difference on issues YOU care about.
- A great community service leadership experience and a reference for your future.
- An understanding of why philanthropy is important.
