Caldor Fire

- <u>El Dorado Community Foundation Caldor Fire Fund</u> has been established to support the families impacted by this fire. All donations to the Caldor Fire Fund will be unrestricted and 100% of donation will go to support those affected
- <u>The American Red Cross of Northern California</u> is currently operating three shelters for victims of the Caldor Fire. For residents who would like to help, the Red Cross requests monetary donations rather than physical donations to the shelter, as staff at shelters are occupied helping evacuated residents.
- <u>The Salvation Army</u>: Teams from the Salvation Army are currently preparing and serving meals at two Caldor Fire shelters; they are currently equipped to serve 270 meals per day to Caldor Fire evacuees. To support its work, the Salvation Army asks residents to donate to its Wildfire Relief Fund. Donations go to food assistance as well as financial assistance for evacuees and other necessary wildfire needs.
